There are so many reasons that this approach can support working together, improve collaboration and achieve better outcomes for children and their families with a clear and unified professional network behind them.



In too many Safeguarding Practice Reviews we hear about lack of professional curiosity, poor communication and/or divides in the professional network. The need for a multi-agency reflective space is designed to address these practice issues in real time through Joint Agency Group Supervision (JAGS). The NSCP has recently taken significant steps to ensure that the fidelity of the JAGS process is adhered to: we now have a fully trained pool of facilitators who will bring independence, containment and compassion to the really challenging safeguarding work that you do. This is not about developing 'group think', nor is it about escalation; we want all professionals to be heard and to have a safe, reflective space where you can understand each other's perspectives, roles and responsibilities.
